What is StationKeeper?

StationKeeper is a marine safety and conservation network powered by AIS (Automatic Identification System) technology. These stations monitor vessel activity and broadcast automated safety messages to ships in nearby waters—encouraging safer navigation and protecting sensitive coastal zones.

Why This Location Matters?

Public sites like aquariums, lighthouses, museums, life saving stations, and historic coastline structures play a critical role in ocean stewardship. Hosting a StationKeeper site allows this location to support real-time communications that reduce vessel strikes, protect marine habitats, and educate the public about ocean conservation.

What This Station Does

Monitors vessel activity in nearby protected waters

Sends automatic speed and safety messages to nearby ships

Supports conservation zones, endangered species, and marine infrastructure

Provides valuable data to mariners, scientists, and conservation groups
